The Partnership for Southern Equity (PSE) advances policies and institutional actions that promote racial equity and shared prosperity for all in the growth of metropolitan Atlanta and the American South. Over ten years, PSE emerged as a leader in a crowded landscape of advocacy organizations by a clear articulation of how public and institutional policies have shaped low-wealth communities of color. We are best known for our energy equity and climate justice work, as well as our central role in expanding the MARTA rail system into Clayton County.

Over ten years, we have grown our resources to support an operation of four core programs and a team of 19. Each program advances a racial equity agenda in health and the economy, as well as in our natural and built environment. All programs employ the following methods: research, grassroots trainings and advocacy through a coalition of external organizations.

The following descriptions of our core programs provide insight on the anchor conduits PSE's utilizes to advance its research and advocacy efforts, as our grant writer will need to have in-depth content knowledge of our efforts:

Just Energy: this program convenes technical experts, advocates, and community members to vision more racially equitable energy policy and co-create clean energy solutions that benefit everyone.

Just Growth: a powerful community engagement platform for residents of all races, incomes, and backgrounds to influence decision-making within development projects that impact them (e.g. housing, retail, infrastructure, transportation).

Just Health: builds strong, sustainable partnerships with grassroots groups for data collection, analysis and policy advocacy in creating opportunities for closing health disparities.

Just Opportunity: works with its partners to advance an economic inclusion agenda that promotes and increases racial equity in the distribution of income, wealth building, employment, and entrepreneurship among vulnerable populations.

We are seeking to add a new member of our team, to research, write and manage grants across all of PSE's programs on a part-time basis, equivalent to 20 hours per week. Please review all of the desired qualifications below carefully.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- A strong understanding of concepts in race, racism, and racial equity;
- Strong familiarity with grassroots organizing and public policy advocacy;
- Strong familiarity with research and writing for advocacy purposes;
- Exceptional writing skills, both in terms of grammar and language use;
- An ability to grasp PSE's organizational narrative and incorporate it into grants; and
- Strong organizational skills.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Writing experience (can be other forms of writing than grant writing);
- Administrative experience (can be other forms of administrative experience than grants management);
- Flexible schedule;
- Familiarity with the philanthropic sector, particularly foundations;
- An ability to manage a grant writing process that requires inputs from multiple people; and
- An ability to work with multiple people with multiple points of view.
