Anchored in love, service, and commitment to historically disinvested frontline communities, the Justice40 Accelerator provides seed funding, technical assistance, training, connections, and peer support for grassroots organizations seeking public funding.

Black, Indigenous, and other Communities of Color on the frontlines of the climate crisis and our dirtyenergy economy are also at the forefront of solutions that protect communities and advance a just transition to a clean-energy economy. Because of structural racism, these communities face extensive barriers to the resources they need to implement and scale their solutions.

Equity is a daily stepping, an everyday series of human actions and decisions, inching or leaping away from very real injustice and inequity, toward very real justice and equality.

By healing first the peoples and places harmed most, and needing those whose networks of power most influence or benefit from, perpetuating structural inequities to restructure and redistribute power, equitably.



Grow by launching a 2023 Cohort of 50 communities implementing community climate solutions.






